Objectives

Through the Kentucky 4-H International Program participants will:

Introduction to Content

According to the U.S. Department of Education International Strategy Report (2012-2016), in order for youth to succeed in the 21st century workplace, they must develop knowledge and understanding of other countries, cultures, languages and perspectives. The overall mission of 4-H is to provide opportunities for youth and adults to work together to create sustainable community change. This is accomplished within the use of three primary content areas, or mission mandates, - citizenship, healthy living, and science. The 4-H Citizenship Mandate places emphasis on young people being engaged and active members of their community, country, and world. Citizenship is the foundation needed to help youth gain a broader understanding of life.

Brazil: The Carnival Celebration



Introduction

Background Information

According to Britannica (2019) Brazil is the largest and furthest East country on the South American Continent. Brazil shares a border with every South American county except Chile and Ecuador. Brazil is the fifth largest country in the world by size with 3,287,956 square miles of land and is the only country that the equator and the tropic of Capricorn run through it. Brazil is home to more than just the rainforest but also includes deserts and a variety of oceanic microclimates.

The arrival of Europeans and the Portuguese empire mixing with indigenous customs is what helped form modern day Brazilian culture. In this activity you will explore the Brazilian tradition of Carnival and the masks adorned during the celebration. Carnival marks the beginning of the Pre-Lent period were a majority of Catholics take their last indulgences of meat, dairy, or other products or lifestyles choices such as social media use before swearing it off during the period known as lent. Remember, Brazil is 65% Catholic making Carnival a large event that many Brazilians take part in. The difference between Carnival and Mardi Gras can be quite confusing. Carnival means the many days leading up to Lent, whereas Mardi Gras or “Fat Tuesday” is the actual day before Lent officially starts. Carnival masks originated in ritual celebrations but were adopted to allow wearers to escape society and class constraints to participate in the festivities. Through the years the masks have become flashier as the popularity of these celebrations has increased.

Instructions for Carnival Mask:

2. Each participant should receive a mask. This can be printed from the template attached to this lesson or a pre-purchased mask. If the mask is a template, print on cardstock and cut out prior to decorating.
3. Each individual should receive a popsicle stick and decorations (for example participants can use: glitter, fake jewelry, markers or feathers). Allow individuals to choose their items so they can best represent their personality through the way they choose to decorate their mask.
4. Use the hot glue to attach the popsicle stick onto the mask so that it may be used to hold the mask up to their face using the stick after the glue has dried.
5. Participants can decorate the mask to best fit their personality.
6. At the conclusion of the activity everyone can share their mask and explain why they chose to decorate it the way they did. Take a group photo!

Reflect and Apply

1. What did you learn about Brazil through this activity?
2. Where you surprised as to why masks are worn for the Carnival celebration?
3. How were you able to showcase your personality through decorating your mask?
4. How does the Carnival celebration relate to any celebrations in your culture?
