







I. Collect a soil sample. To collect a sample, take a garden trowel or shovel, go outside (anywhere will work backyard, neighborhood, Extension office just make sure you have permission before digging a sample), and prepare to dig a sample. To dig a sample, do your best to remove any grass, plants, or mulch, and then dig a hole about 6 inches dip. Then collect about 1/2 - 1 cup of soil from the hole.

- 2. Place about 1/2 I cup of soil in ajar.
- 3. Add water to the jar, leaving only around \square inch at the top.
- 4. Place the lid on the jar (make sure the lid fits tight!).
- 5. Shake the jar until all the soil is mixed with the water.
- 6. Allow the jar to sit for at least 24 hours. Do not disturb the jar.
- 7. After the jar has sat for at least 24 hours, observe the jar.

Do you see different layers? These layers are the sand, silt, and clay particles and organic matter in the soil. To learn more about soil and natural resources in Kentucky, contact your county 4-H agent.

Plant Science

- Cut a piece of pothos. Make sure the cutting has at least three or four nodes (these are the small bumps on the vine where new roots will grow).
- Remove the bottom leaves. Leave at least two or three leaves at the top.
- Place the bottom part of the cutting in water, leaving the leaves out of the water.
- When there are several long roots, your cutting is ready to plant in soil.




- Create a recreation/activity plan for your club and lead the activities
